Did you know that you can print out a copy of your AMA card online? Now there is no need to wait for one to be sent to you. Just log in to your profile page on the AMA web site (modelaircraft.org) and you will see an image of your card that you can print out - handy if you've lost the original or if you need a copy in a hurry!

Some of you may recall that the FAA published rules for Remote ID and that they were scheduled to go into effect in September 2022. Of most importance to our club members is the part that says you do not need Remote ID if you are operating at a FRIA supported by a CBO! Okay, I know that is too many acronyms. Our field is eligible to become an FAA Recognized Identification Area (FRIA) since we are an AMA affiliated club and the AMA is a Community Based Organization (CBO). The fly in the ointment is that the FAA has not started the FRIA process. That's okay, though. It just means nothing is happening yet. AMA intends to do the major part of the FRIA process legwork for us once the process starts. AMA will contact he Club to confirm the information about our field and then will file the paperwork.
